# Pan-Canadian RDA Training Workshop (Manitoba)

**January 23-24, 2013**

## **Description**

A two-day workshop on cataloguing with Resource Description and Access (RDA), the successor to the Anglo-American Cataloguing Rules. The workshop will be presented as a series of modules over the course of two full days. Each module focuses on a particular aspect of RDA and combines presentation with exercises and discussion. Originally developed by the Library of Congress for its own cataloguers, these modules have been revised for the Canadian context by members of the Pan-Canadian Working Group on Cataloguing with RDA.

## **Objective**

The objective of the workshop is to make attendees sufficiently familiar with RDA that they will feel comfortable both with cataloguing to the new standard, and providing RDA training to cataloguers at their libraries.

## **Target Audience**

Front-line cataloguers, metadata specialists, and cataloguing trainers, working in libraries or cultural institutions in Manitoba which are planning to adopt RDA.
